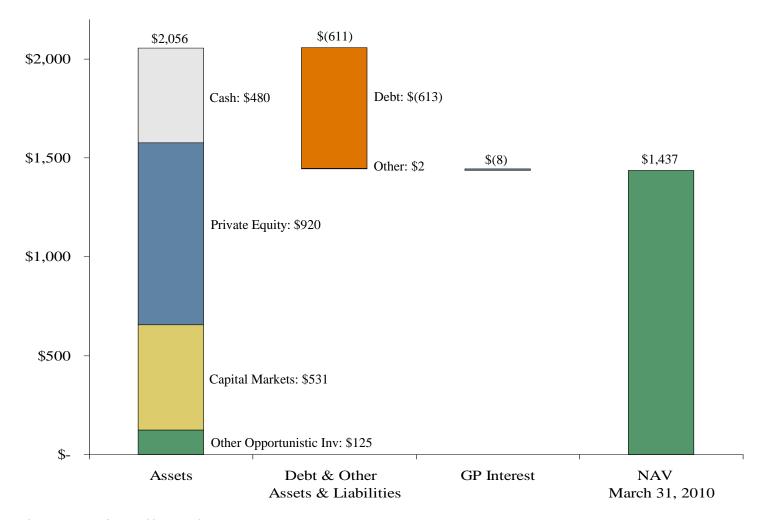

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Recent Portfolio Company Re-financings



- Over \$8.6 bn of re-financings across six transactions since Dec. '08
- Retired remaining near-term maturities with \$750 mm offering in April '10



- •\$500 mm second lien offering in Q3 '09
- Debt exchange improved liquidity to approx \$1 bn, provided cushion for first lien covenant

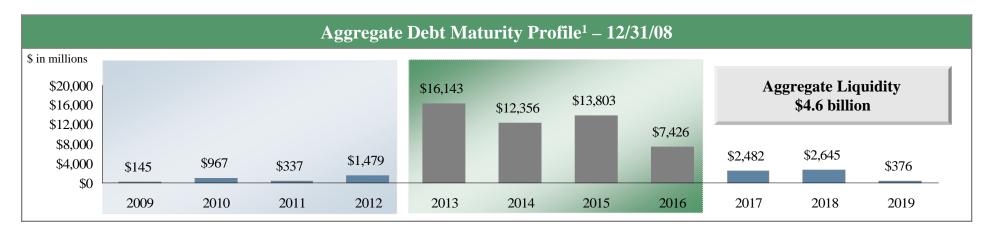


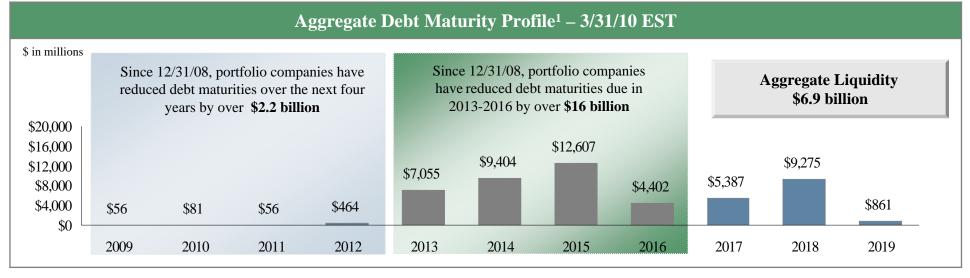
- \$750 mm senior secured revolver and \$450 mm senior secured note offering in Q4 '09
- •Extended maturities from '12 and '13 to '15 and '16



- Approx \$2 bn of term loan and revolver re-financings in Q1 '10
- Repaid portion of term loan; extended most remaining maturities from '13 to '15

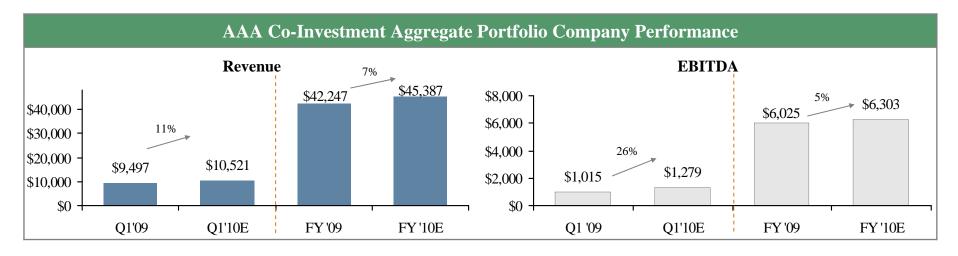

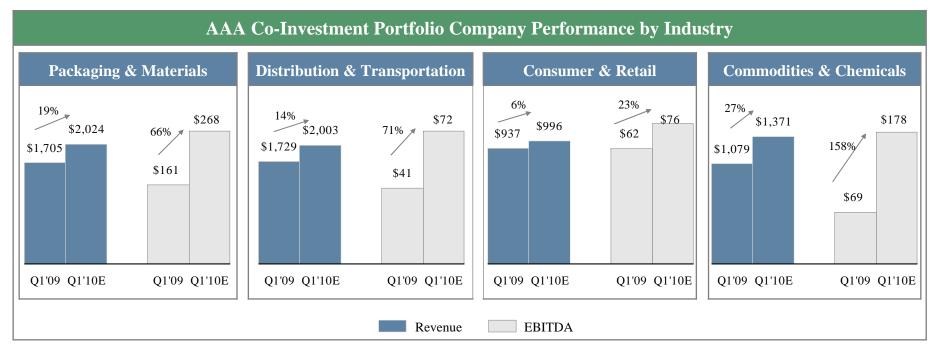




Since 12/31/08, total maturities due through 2016 have been reduced by over \$18 billion

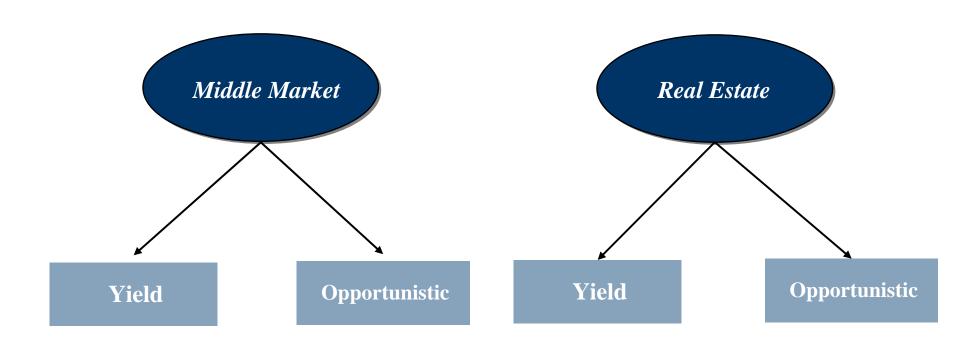

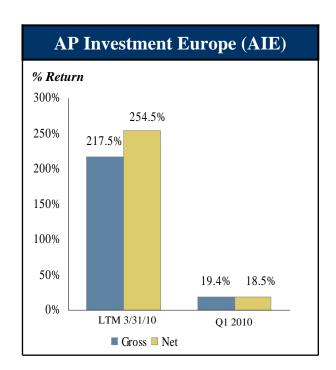

- ➤ Positive results for Athene in Q1 2010 driven by:
 - Acquisition of additional policies, which increased the business by approximately 25%
 - Increased portfolio yield due to diversification of Athene's asset mix

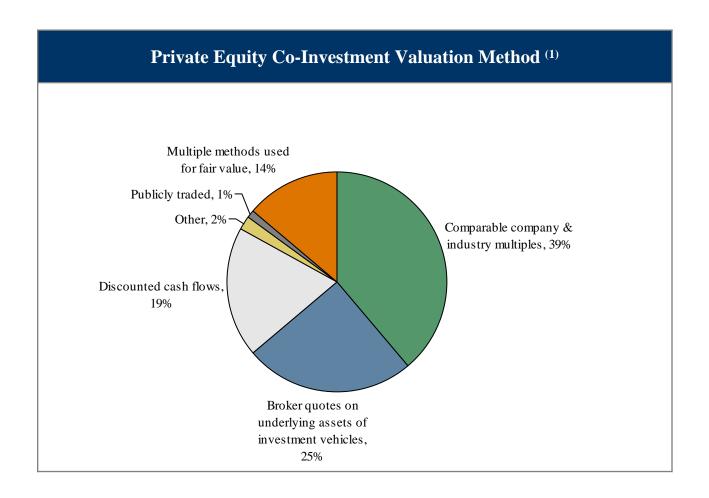

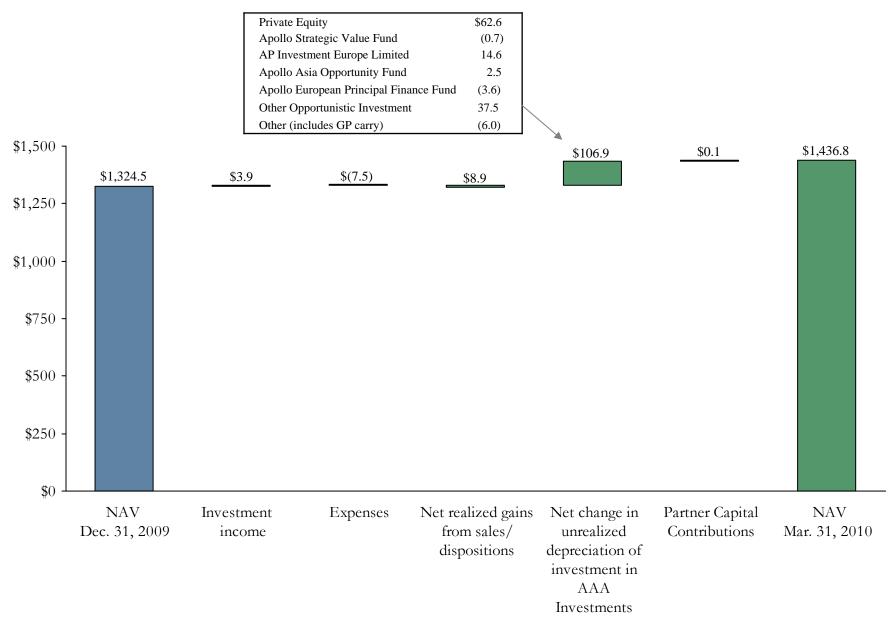
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Private Equity Valuation Methodology

➤ At March 31, 2010 AAA's portfolio of private equity investments was valued based on the methodologies below



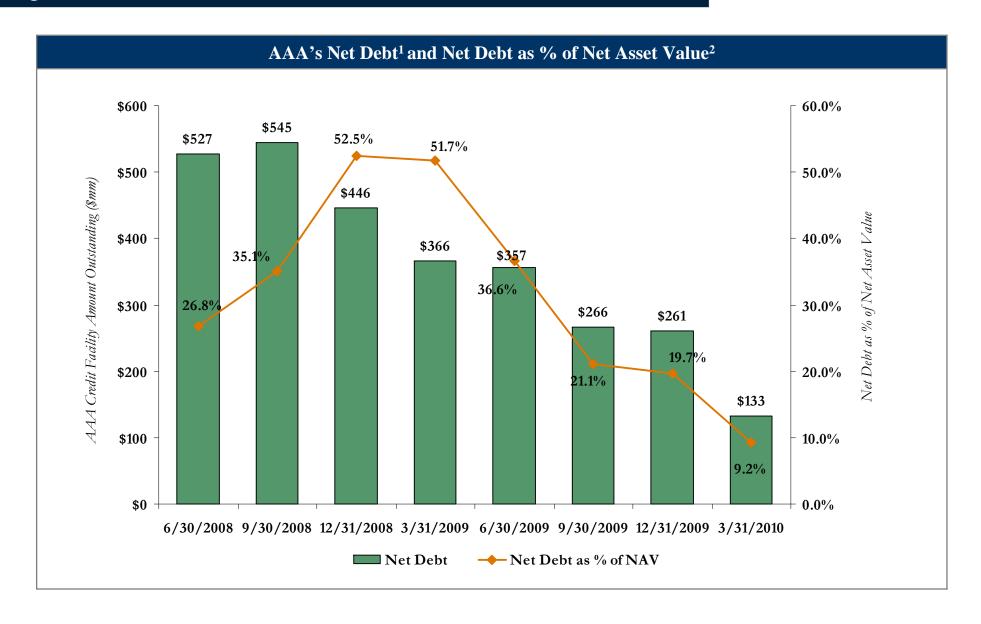
Q1 2010 NAV Performance

Update on Redemptions & Monetizations

➤ During 2008 and 2009 AAA requested redemptions from SVF and AOF, and agreed to a monetization plan in 2009 with respect to AIE

Apollo Strategic Value Fund (SVF)

- ➤ In 2008, AAA requested redemption of \$475 million
 - \$200 million redeemed in 2008
 - \$163 million redeemed in 2009
- ➤ Remainder of redemption converted into liquidating shares issued by SVF, with cash proceeds realized as investments are liquidated
 - \$10 million redeemed through March 31, 2010

Asia Opportunity Offshore Fund (AOF)

- ➤ During 2009, AAA requested redemptions of shares with a total value of \$140 million
 - \$49 million redeemed in 2009
- Redemptions converted into liquidating shares issued by AOF, with cash proceeds realized as investments are liquidated
 - \$43 million redeemed through March 31, 2010

AP Investment Europe (AIE)

- ➤ During July 2009, AIE shareholders approved a three-year monetization plan for the fund
 - Opportunistically selling assets over a 3-year period
- First distribution of \$25 million received on March 31, 2010

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
